

About the Kurita Award

The Kurita Award is given to students of the College of Law and Politics based on donations from the bereaved family of the late Professor Tetsuo Kurita. The aim is to encourage them to study abroad at universities overseas in line with the wishes of the late Professor Kurita, to award those who have made outstanding achievements in studying abroad, and to grant a cash award as a form of encouragement for learning.

Eligibility: Among students of the College of Law and Politics who studied abroad at universities in foreign countries that are partner institutions of this university, and of those who studied abroad at approved schools, those who achieved remarkable results from studying abroad, submitted overseas study report after returning to Japan, and received credit recognition.

Selection: The College Faculty Meeting of the College of Law and Politics selects and decides from the persons who submitted overseas study report and received credit recognition. No award will be granted in years when there are no qualified persons.

Scholarship cash award: 100,000 yen

Recognition: If the winner graduates at the end of the academic year in which the overseas study report to be awarded is submitted, the recognition will be made and a cash award will be granted at the ceremony for the certificate of graduation from the College of Law and Politics. If the winner is a current student, the Dean will separately make a recognition and grant a cash award at the end of the academic year in which the overseas study report to be awarded is submitted.
